Westlaw provides immigration law professionals with a comprehensive library of databases covering the rights of foreign persons in the United States. Among the subjects included are the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952; the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA); the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996; the Uniting and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism (USA Patriot) Act of 2001; and the admission, exclusion, expulsion, and naturalization of aliens.

Other databases include federal cases; statutes; administrative materials from the Board of Alien Labor Certification Appeals (BALCA), the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA), and the Office of the Chief Administrative Hearing Officer; and practice materials including *Board of Alien Labor Certification Appeals Deskbook*, *Immigration Procedures Handbook*, *Immigration Law Service 2d*, and *Interpreter Releases*.
