

# Medical Malpractice Databases

Westlaw provides the legal practitioner with a comprehensive library of databases that relate to medical malpractice, including primary sources such as cases and statutes and secondary sources such as legal texts and periodicals, as well as jury materials, public records, and expert witness and medical information.
