This database contains:

- Full-text patents granted by the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) (coverage begins with 1790)
- Patent applications filed with the USPTO (coverage begins with March 2001)

Full-text patents, along with all drawings, can be viewed as a PDF file. For patents issued prior to 1976, the text of a patent included front-page information such as title, author, assignee, related applications, classification data, cited references, and an abstract, together with a brief summary of the invention, a description of the drawings, and a detailed description of the preferred embodiment of the invention with examples and all claims.

### Dockets – Patent

Docket information on patent-related cases filed in U.S. district courts. These records indicate whether legal action may have been filed involving particular parties.

### Intellectual Property Docket Summaries

The Intellectual Property Docket Summaries database contains docket header and intellectual property information from patent and trademark lawsuits filed in U.S. district courts. The documents include the title of the action, name of the court, docket number, filing date, cause of action, and names of the parties. Patent information includes the patent number, application number, title and abstract of the patent, U.S. and international classes, inventors and assignees. Trademark information includes the name of the mark, the mark type, serial and registration numbers, drawing code, goods and services description, U.S. and international classes and owner names. Uses for docket summaries include:

- Research litigation history of patents for purposes of due diligence, regulatory compliance, or inclusion as prior art
- Research litigation history of trademarks
- Search for litigation involving similar patents as an aid in drafting claims and applications
- Search for patent litigation by inventor, assignee name, or patent application number
- Search for trademark litigation by owner, serial number, or registration number
- Monitor new litigation involving specific patents, trademarks, classification codes, or parties

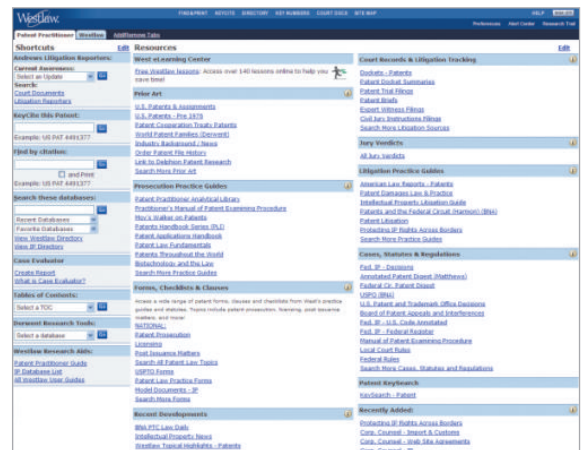
