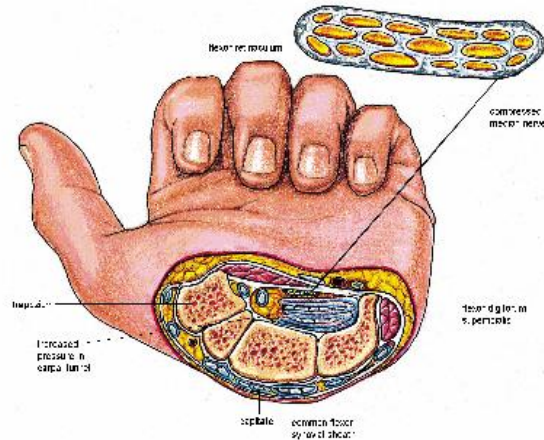

Spinal nerves—Limb innervation—Median nerve (arm)</p> <p>Median nerve, like the radial nerve, originates in the brachial plexus and stretches down the arm through the wrist into the hand. Bordered by the carpal (wrist) bones and the inelastic transverse carpal ligament (flexor retinaculum), the carpal tunnel forms a rigid passage through which the flexor tendons and the median nerve enter the hand. The median nerve carries both sensory and motor nerve fibers. Within the carpal tunnel, sensory fibers of the median nerve innervate the volar (palm) aspect of the thumb, index and middle fingers, and half of the ring finger; sensation on the dorsal surface of the distal index, middle and half of the ring finger is also transmitted by sensory fibers of the median nerve. The median nerve also has a branch on the surface of the carpal ligament that transmits sensation to the palm of the hand. Median nerve motor fibers passing through the carpal tunnel innervate the muscles of the hand. In addition, the median nerve carries most of the sympathetic (unconscious muscle control—ex., constriction of blood vessels) nerve supply to the hand.
